Humanity First Fundraising Dinner For Toronto's First Shelter Bus for Homeless

Vaughan, Ontario, Canada – Around 35,000 Canadians are homeless on any given night, and overall at least 235,000 Canadians experience homelessness in a year. Homeless shelters are typically at capacity, especially in the winter months making homeless individuals extremely susceptible and at risk to the severe cold weather.

Humanity First Shelter Bus is an initiative of Humanity First Canada to provide temporary relief to homeless individuals by providing a safe and warm place to sleep overnight.

Humanity First is undertaking this project by converting a coach bus into a temporary mobile shelter for homeless. The interior of the coaches will be renovated to include living spaces, washroom, and 20 beds for sleeping in a bunk bed format.
