The Humanity First Shelter Bus is a mobile shelter that will augment shelter space during the winter when Toronto's emergency shelters and respite sites are overburdened. The Shelter bus will have 20 beds, lounge spaces, and a kitchenette to provide a comfortable place to serve the homeless community.

Our team has been working hard to raise awareness of this project and the issue of homelessness in our communities. We've received some amazing support and managed to raise over 30,000 dollars so far which will go directly into ensuring the Shelter Bus can help those in need. Some of the ways our volunteers have come together are:

• Participating in "Coldest Night of the Year", a walk-a-thon that helps raise funds for charities

that benefit the hungry and homeless in our communities.

- Reaching out to community members door-todoor to showcase what we are doing
- Speaking to people under the "Mosaic Interfaith Out of the Cold Program" who shared their experiences of being homeless and inspired us to keep going.

We're so proud to see that our bus is almost ready to hit the streets. Recently the HVAC upgrade and paint job of the bus were completed thanks to the hard work of those working with MTB transit solutions.

The Shelter Bus team is also looking to provide homeless kits to each person who uses our bus which will include essentials to stay safe during the winter.

- Community Care: Our Senior's Fitness class made a trip to the Maple Library in February. Since many of them have never been before, they were given a tour and tutorials on how to sign out books, and use other resources available to them in the library. Several made a library card and left excited to come back.
- Water for Life: We built 2 water wells in Pakistan and 10 in Africa.
- **Food Security:** We also distributed food to approximately 7000 people in Africa this past month.

The Humanity First Food Bank in Vaughan has had a busy winter season. With several clients coming in daily, our volunteers have put in 100s of hours packing and delivering food to those in need.
