### HUMANITY FIRST ASSISTS VICTIMS OF PAKISTAN FLOOD RELIEF

#### **VOLUNTEERS PROVIDE EMERGENCY SUPPLIES, FOOD, AND SHELTER**

Heavy rainfall from this year's monsoon season led to floods across Pakistan, with more than 33 million people affected and more than 1,000 killed. Humanity First immediately planned and sent out teams in response to this urgent appeal. Humanity First provided vital humanitarian aid by working with local partners. Food, drinking water, tents, and other emergency supplies are being provided to the affected people. Furthermore, HF is also running medical outreach clinics to provide free check-ups for victims. Humanity First will continue to aid the affected people and is planning Phase 2, which will consist of the rehabilitation stage.

### FUNDRAISERS

In Canada, HF organized a fundraising event to support the flood victims in Pakistan, with many dignitaries in attendance. The attendees donated generously, and HF was able to reach its fundraising target.

### ORPHAN CARE

Humanity First's Orphan Care program supports children around the world who are left orphaned due to various reasons, including war and disease. HF provides them with a safe and healthy upbringing. Starting this quarter 5 more orphans will be supported in Congo Brazzaville and one more in Cameroon.

The Orphan Care program now provides food security, education, shelter, healthcare, and basic living needs for 83 children in Cameroon, 20 children in Congo Brazzaville, and 20 in Nigeria.



### KNOWLEDGE FOR LIFE

Under the Knowledge for Life program, Humanity First builds schools and vocational training centers for underprivileged individuals. HF supports these children in their educational journey by providing them with resources, supplies, and classroom transformation.

#### **CONGO BRAZZAVILLE**

- Two schools in Village Itali and Village Mpoutisian continue to provide free education to 118 students.
- The new Sewing Centre successfully continues operation in Nkayi City with eight registered students.

# REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT

Humanity First's Refugee Resettlement Program sponsors refugees and tackles the and resettles forced displacement of families and entire communities.

19 new refugee families arrived in this quarter, which included 69 people in total. All families were received at the airport and were provided early settlement reports.

The work on their early settlement needs, including financial and non-financial, was initiated. All relevant documents about the newcomers' early settlement process were organized as they were received.



# GLOBAL HEALTH

Humanity First's Global Health program, offers primary health care services, constructs hospitals, and runs medical camps in areas in need.

- In addition, 54 poor children were also assisted with providing educational supplies in various locations such as Brazzaville, Gamboma, Fouta Pointe-Noire, Nkayi, and Mouyondji.

#### HAITI

Masroor Primary School continues its operation in Village Beauchamps, Haiti where 32 students receive free education. The school has three teachers and is open 5 days a week, from 8 am – 1 pm.

#### **NIGERIA**

Humanity First continues to operate two schools in Oyo State, providing free education to 75 primary students. One school is located in Iye-Osa Village and the other school is in Igbo-Oruwo Village.



# GIFT OF SIGHT

- In Nigeria, Humanity First runs a cataract eye surgery clinic through which 120 free cataract eye surgeries were conducted in this quarter.
- 30 eye surgeries were done from July September in Temeke, Tanzania, in partnership with CareAid Africa Foundation.

A 4-day Medical Outreach Camp was carried out in Majoda, Lagos State, in Nigeria, from August 25th – 28th, serving 689 beneficiaries. Services provided included; 20 surgeries, 470 lab tests, provision of eyeglasses to 85 beneficiaries, 120 mass dewormings, and 500 drug dispenses based on consultations.

Forty-six volunteers assisted in the camp, including seven doctors, six nurses, six pharmacists, one optometrist, and three optometrist assistants.

### CHAIRMAN MESSAGE



With every new day, we see increased suffering around the world. Humanity First teams are always at the forefront of helping those in need. Our work continues to grow as climate change is increasing flooding around the globe. This quarter, we saw two significant floodings in Pakistan and Bangladesh that forced over 33,000 individuals to be displaced, causing them to lose their homes and belongings. HF is planning a phase 2 rehabilitation stage for the victims of Pakistan that will focus on rebuilding and constructing homes. In addition, we built 12 water wells in Chad and completed a water desalination unit in Palestine that serves a total of 33,000 individuals.

Furthermore, we support underprivileged children through our Orphan Care and Knowledge for Life program to over 400 children. A 4-day Medical Outreach Clinic in Nigeria served over 1,200 individuals. Locally, our Food Bank continues to help and assist over a thousand families monthly, and that number is increasing every day due to economic and political crises. With this increase, we also see a high demand for help from our volunteers and donors.

I am thankful to each volunteer and donor who help us reach our goals of creating sustainable solutions in education, food security, global health, clean water, eye care, and disaster relief.

### DISASTER RELIEF

#### BANGLADESH

Within the span of one month, the people of Sunmaganj District faced three major flooding events due to repeated heavy rainfall and an onrush of upstream hilly waters, leaving thousands of villagers trapped in their homes. HF provided relief to flood victims, distributing emergency food hampers which included oil, rice, and lentils, as well as fresh meat to 92 families.

right. However, millions of individuals around the world are deprived of this necessity. Humanity First Canada builds sustainable water solutions in these countries to provide the residents with clean drinking water that helps improve their livelihoods.

From July to September, 12 water wells were built in the villages of Chad, resulting in 4,280 beneficiaries.



#### PALESTINE

In partnership with HF UK & ANERA, HF Canada installed a Reverse Osmosis (RO) System and Solar Panels in Jabalia City, a small community north of Gaza, to increase access to clean water. The project serves a total of 33,000 beneficiaries.



Recently innaugrated clothing bank under HF Nigeria continues to operate. In this quarter, 1000 units of clothing were washed and distributed to 200+ beneficiaries. Furthermore a food drive was conducted in Kano, collecting over 30 units of clothing and renovations were completed in the Port Harcourt Clothing Bank.

#### CANADA

Three gardening sessions were held for seniors that taught them ways, methods and benefits of gardening.

- A Gardening Workshop at a community garden in the City of Vaughan was held where trainers at the community garden taught 22 members the type of soil to use, growing plants directly from seeds, protecting plants, etc.
- Another gardening workshop was held in partnership with York Region Food Network. 14 participants attended the workshop and learnt about techniques behind weeding, seeding and pruning.
- A session about benefits of gardening for seniors, indoor planting, the types of vegetables that can be grown from a garden was conducted at the HF headquarter, through which 18 members benefitted.

With the growing financial impact, Canadians are accessing and relying on food banks more than ever. Humanity First Feed, a Family Food Bank, has seen an increasing demand for food and other necessities in previous years. With the increasing number of clients accessing the Humanity First Food Bank, the demand for volunteers and food donations is also increasing. On average, HF Food Bank serves over a thousand families monthly, and the number of new clients is increasing daily.

We are truly thankful to all of our hard-working volunteers who make our goal of serving every needy individual around us possible. In addition, we are also thankful to our donors and supporters who help in aiding the needy with us.

### MS EXCEL TRAINING SESSIONS

A training workshop was organized on MS Excel for volunteers consisting of 6 sessions, starting from July 23rd, 2022. The workshops focused on training in Excel workbooks, managing worksheets, data entry in cells, formatting, use of essential functions and computations, and many more key learning strands. In total, 11 participants benefitted from these sessions.
